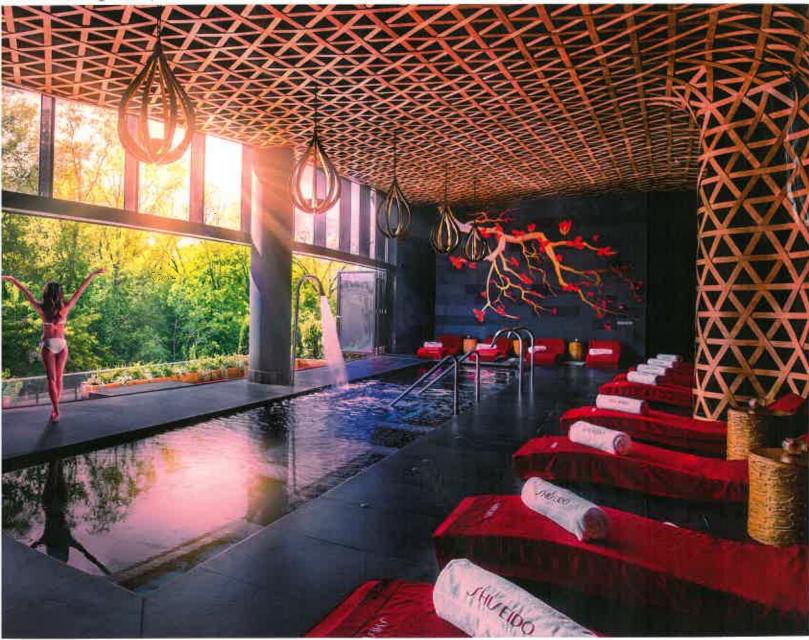

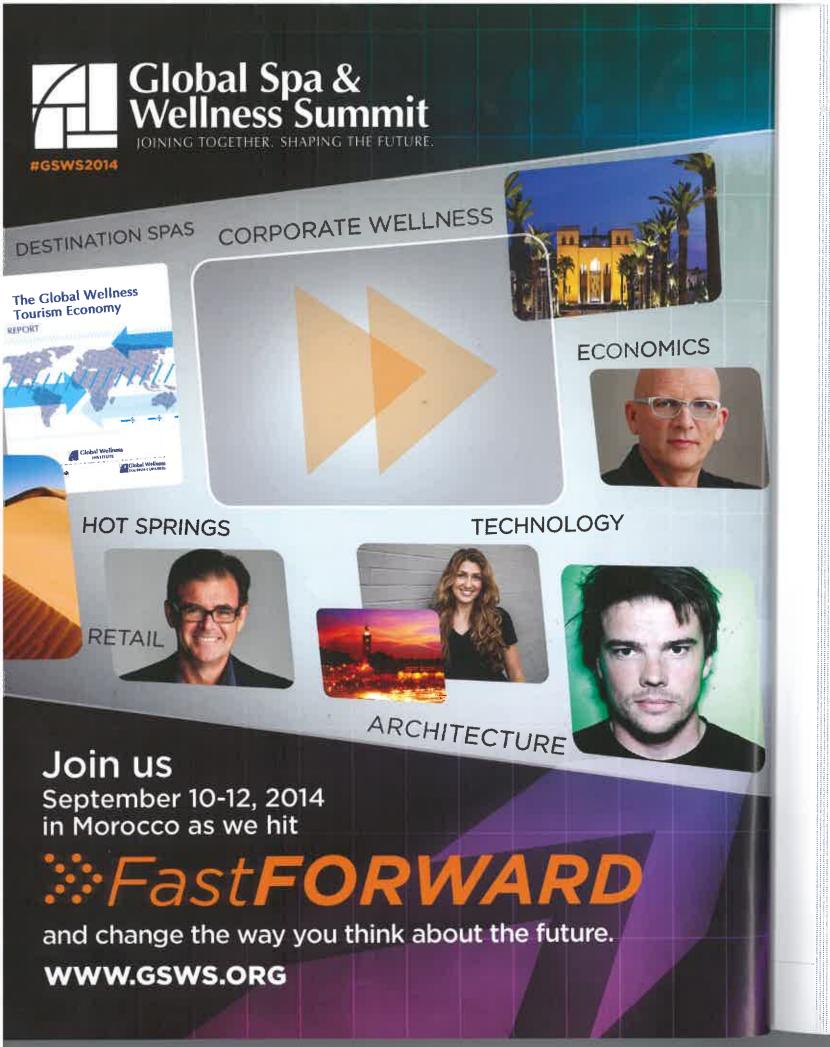

## Six Senses to premier in Europe at World Heritage Site

Portugal The first European resort location for the Six Senses group has been confirmed as the Portuguese UNESCO World Heritage area of the Douro Valley.

The 2,200sqm Six Senses Spa will offer ten treatment rooms, heated indoor and outdoor pools, an outdoor bar and a Technogym-equipped gym. Six Senses speciality treatments and programmes will be offered as well as a menu of locally-inspired therapies, including some that will be wine-based.

The spa menu will also include the Six Senses Visiting Practitioner Programme, which offers over 100 of the world's leading healers, practitioners and experts across a comprehensive range of disciplines.

Vice-president of spa and wellness at Six Senses, Anna Bjurstam commented: "We are excited about this opening as it will be our first resort in Europe and will feature an expansive spa. Its location – the oldest

Looking to the future, Bjurstam said the group would continue to build on its strong foundations.
